## Introduction



or 7 decades, the Tecnológico de Monterrey has been a benchmark for the private higher education sector in Mexico and Latin America. We have driven domestic and regional growth through research, entrepreneurship and social development.

At the Tecnológico de Monterrey, we know that today's society demands citizens with a global outlook who show a sincere appreciation for diversity and who have the ability to adapt to a wide range of culturally diverse environments. That is why internationalization is a fundamental pillar for our institution.

In order to ensure that our students and teachers fully develop these intercultural habits, each campus promotes, on an on-going basis, the incorporation of teachers from different countries, international mobility for lecturers, and student exchanges to all 5 continents. During study sessions or collaborative projects, the entire community takes part in multicultural dialog, thus creating a learning environment which is conducive to developing intercultural habits, respect, and appreciation for other people's cultures.

Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), a British ratings agency, has rated the qualities of educational institutions in a number of different areas, including internationalization. In 2013, the Tecnológico de Monterrey was awarded a 5-star rating by QS Star Rating, ranking it as a world-class university in areas such as teaching, internationalization, employability, innovation, infrastructure and commitment to the community. Around 40 universities currently have a global five-star rating, and the Tecnológico de Monterrey has become the first university in Mexico to be awarded this rating.


During 2013 **8,692** students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey studied an international program in more than 50 countries.

## International Student Mobility

Student mobility is an essential component of the Tecnológico de Monterrey's vision, and it forms an important part of the processes of cooperation, exchange and integration among Higher Education institutions around the world.

In order to drive and promote international education, during 2013 1,199 academic opportunities were offered to students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey to study abroad. Some 8,692 students, who travelled to more than 50 countries, took part in these International Programs.

In order to offer our students a multi-cultural environment, the Tecnológico de Monterrey promotes a cultural academic environment throughout all of its campuses by attracting international students. In 2013, 4,483 international students came to the Tecnológico de Monterrey from 71 different countries. The table and graph below show, by geographical zone, the distribution of the number of students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey who studied in another country, as well as the international students who studied at one of our campuses.





#### Student Mobility 2013





#### Tecnológico de Monterrey Students Distribution by Zone






### **Student Destinations**



#### **Special Programs**


The Tecnológico de Monterrey forges strategic alliances with prestigious universities around the world. As a result of this collaboration, dual-degree programs and special projects, such as the International Program of Excellence (IPE HONORS), are made possible. The latter offers outstanding students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey the opportunity to study for a summer, a semester or a year at the best universities in the world. This program not only allows outstanding students to take classes with students from these universities, as well as many other countries, but it also offers the Tec's best teachers the opportunity to give classes in their areas of expertise or take part in research programs.

More than 800 students have taken part in the IPE HO-NORS and there are currently 18 programs available.



## International Students at the Tecnológico de Monterrey



#### Distribution of International Students by Zone








## Glossary

**Campus:** A physical space, property or land in legitimate use and pertaining to the Tecnológico de Monterrey, in which are located the Institution's own facilities and service centers, as well as those under its control.

**QS Stars Evaluation:** QS Stars is a leading British company specializing in international university rankings. It offers universities the opportunity to showcase their strengths through the ranking they achieve, which is carried out using an evaluation system which grades strengths and provides the institution with a star rating stemming from the audit.

**Internationalization:** The necessity to find new markets in response to the strong competition within our local or domestic market.

**Student Mobility:** The possibility of taking part in a study program at an international Institution, with which there is an existing agreement framework. For the Tecnológico de Monterrey, this mobility period is included in all academic syllabi and is therefore obligatory. **IPE HONORS:** International Program of Excellence Honor is a specialized program for outstanding students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey.

**Zone:** The organizational areas into which the Tecnológico de Monterrey is divided. These zones represent a group of campuses or schools depending on their geographical region.

**International Students:** These are students of nationality other than Mexican who are attending an academic program or are on an academic stay at Tecnológico de Monterrey.

**Degree Seeking International Students:** Are international students enrolled in an academic program to earn an undergraduate or graduate degree from Tecnológico de Monterrey.

**Non-Degree Seeking International Students:** Are international students enrolled for an academic period at Tecnológico de Monterrey.
