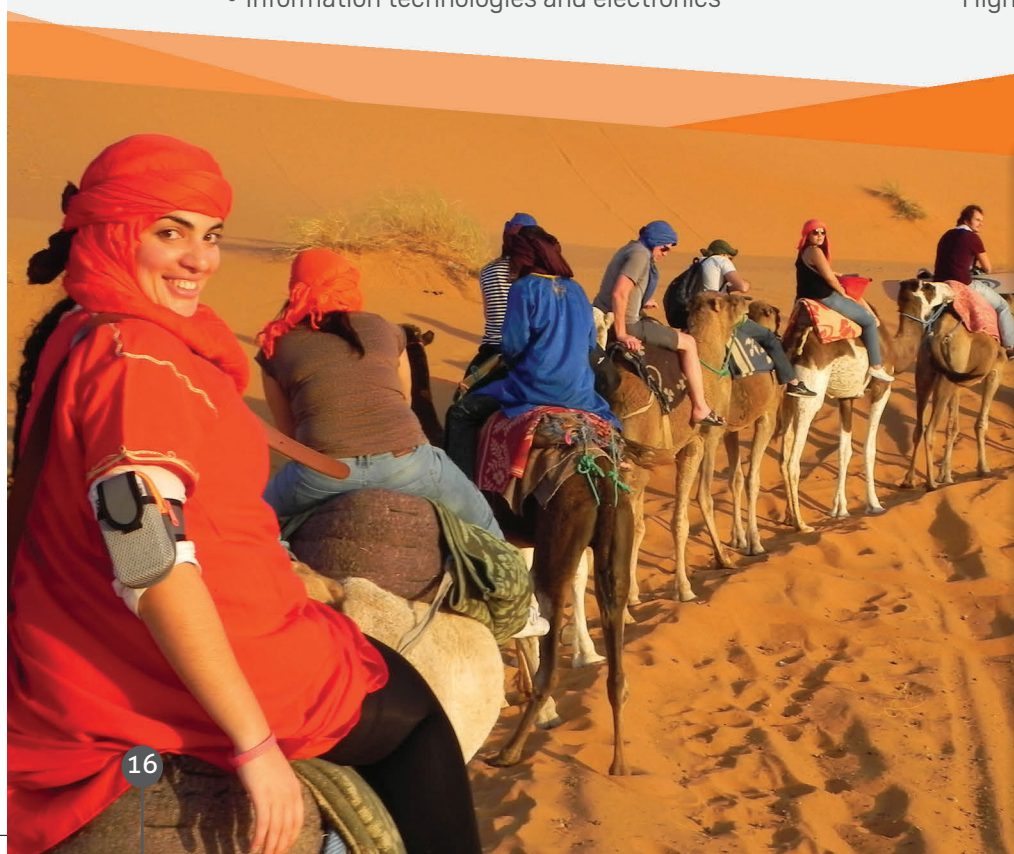

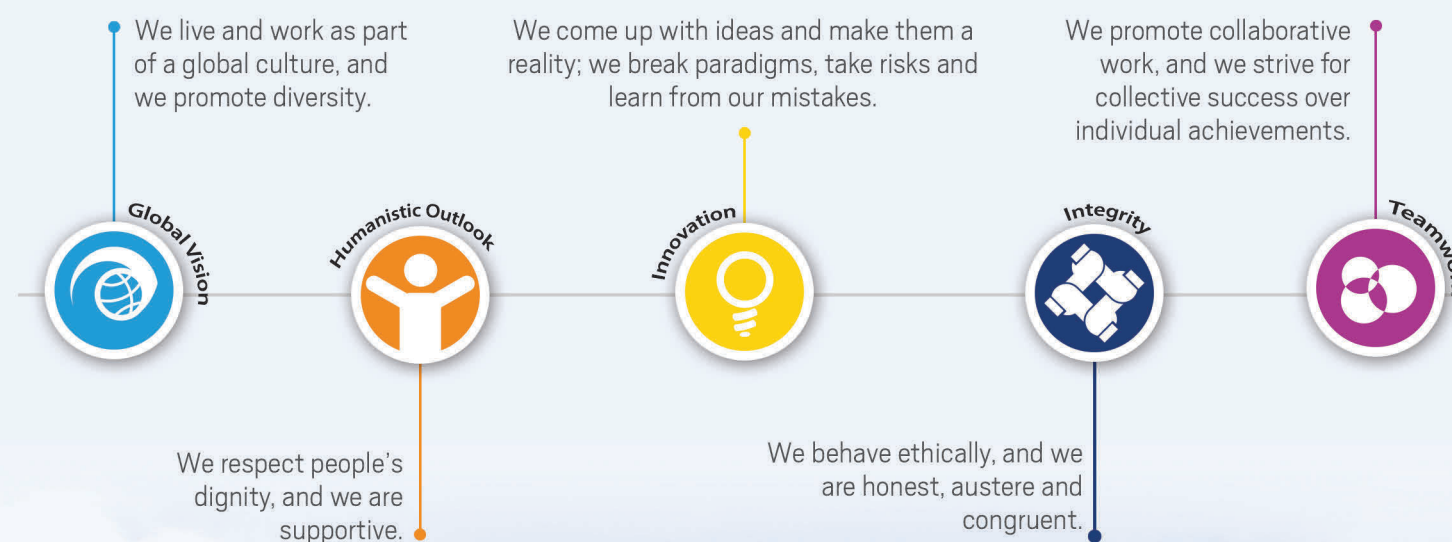

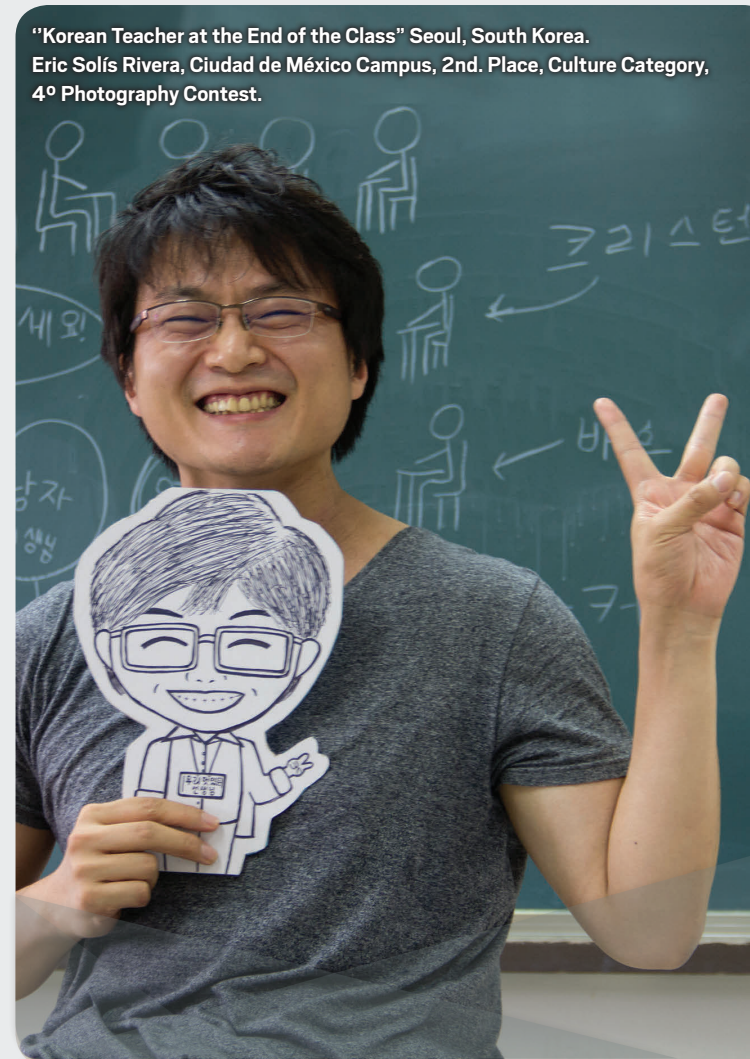

Faculty, students, staff and all members of the community make internationalization at the Tecnológico de Monterrey a reality.

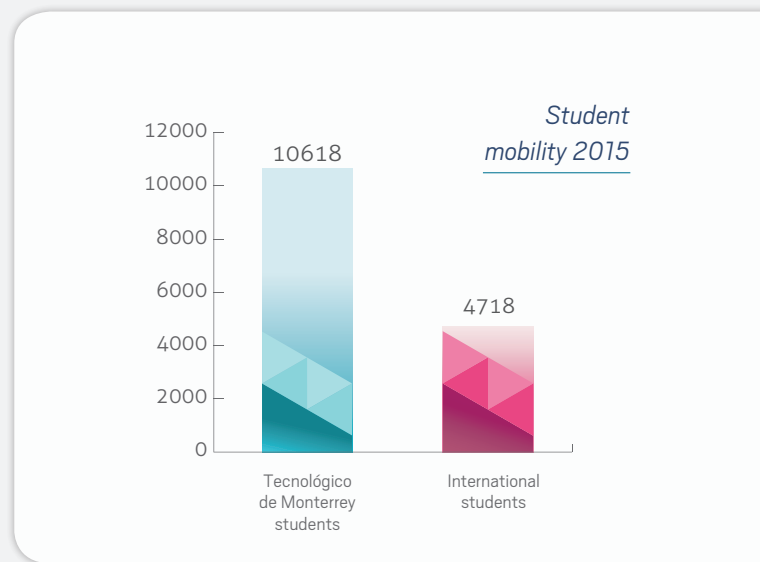

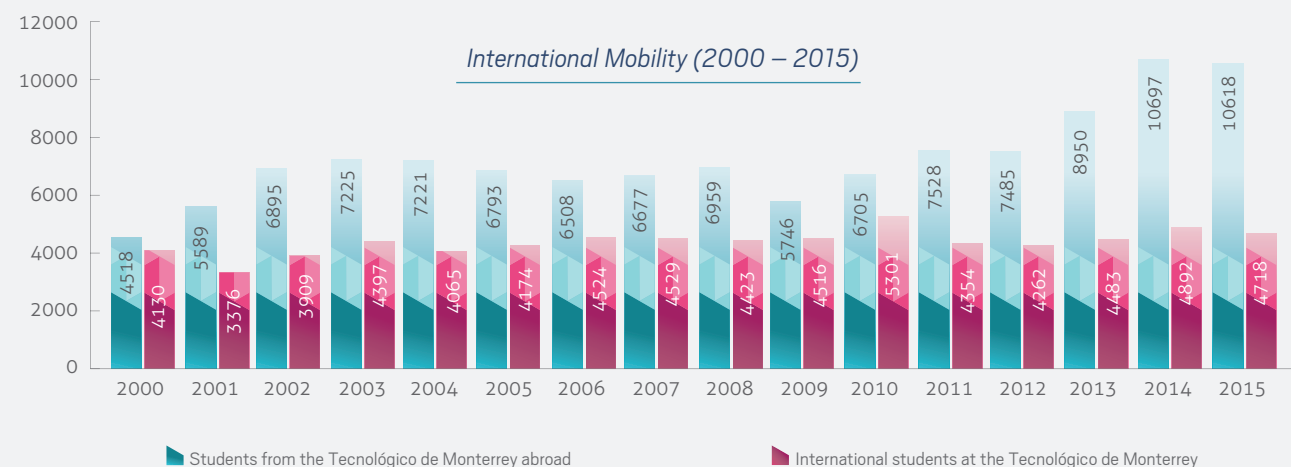
Student mobility

International mobility has always been a fundamental pillar of the Tecnológico de Monterrey. Experiences in other countries bring with them a range of benefits to the students and faculty members who decide to take part. Internationalization plays a major role in the processes of cooperation, exchange and integration among higher education institutions around the world, including our own.

Since the year 2000, more than 116,000 students from Tecnológico de Monterrey have taken part in international experiences in more than 50 countries around the world. Furthermore, more than 70,000 international students from more than 70 countries have visited one of the Tecnológico de Monterrey's 31 campuses.

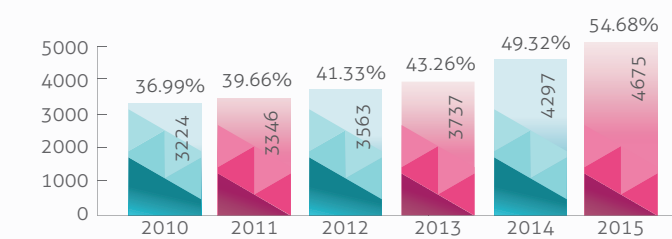

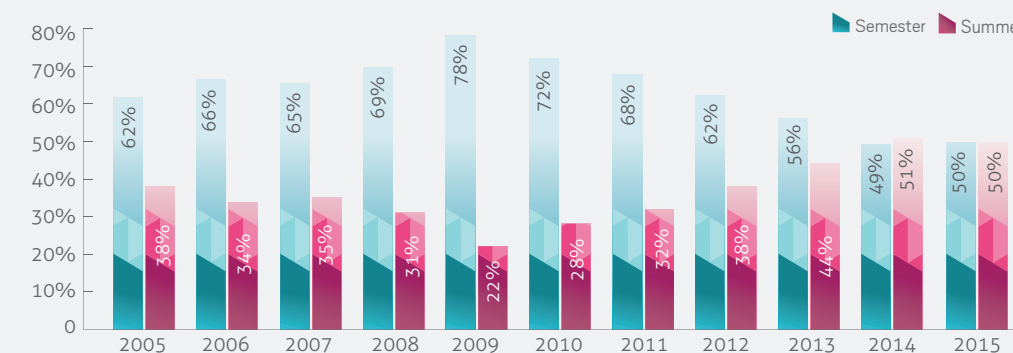

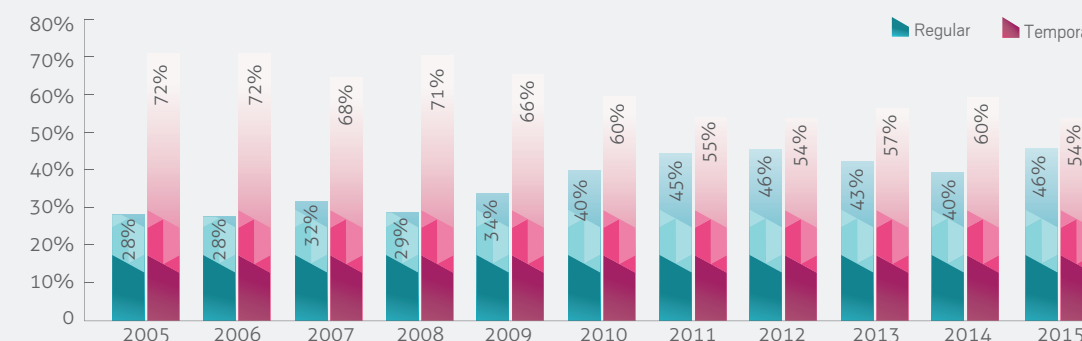

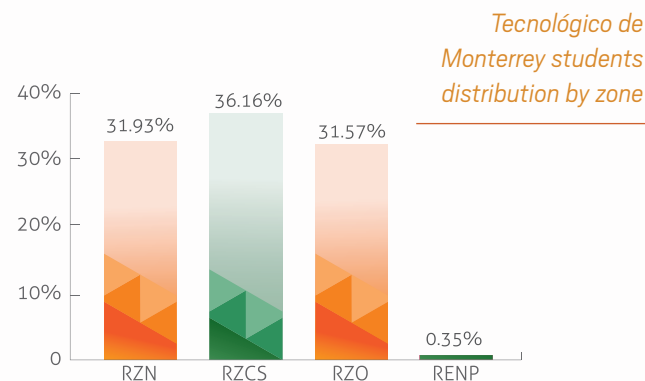
Students from Tecnológico de Monterrey abroad

In 2015, the QS World University Rankings published its list of the top 800 universities in the world, with the Tecnológico de Monterrey ranking at #238 in the world and #9 among universities in Latin America.

Internationalization has become a determining factor for the institution, which is why we are one of the universities with the highest number of academic cooperation agreements in Latin America. The following graphs and tables show the number, percentages and distribution of students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey who took part in an international experience during 2015.

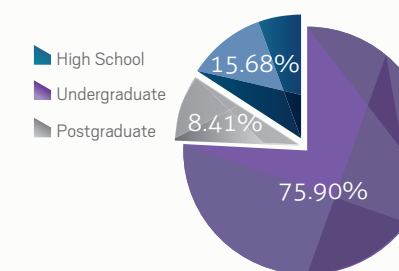

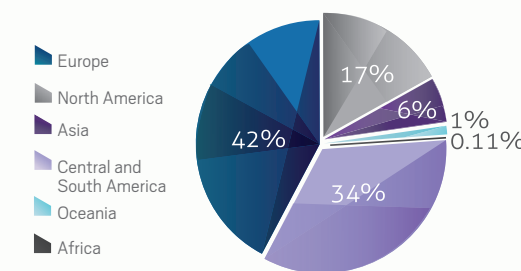

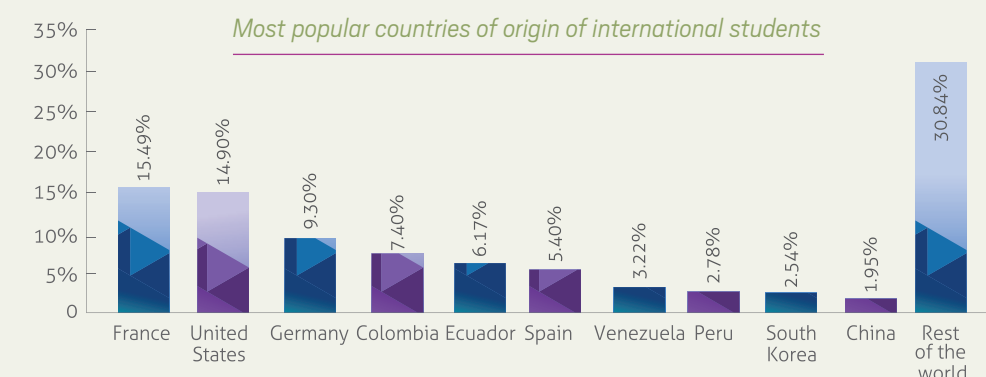
Distribution of international students by academic level

Most popular countries of origin of international students



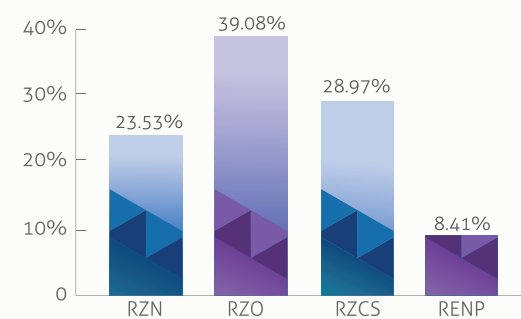

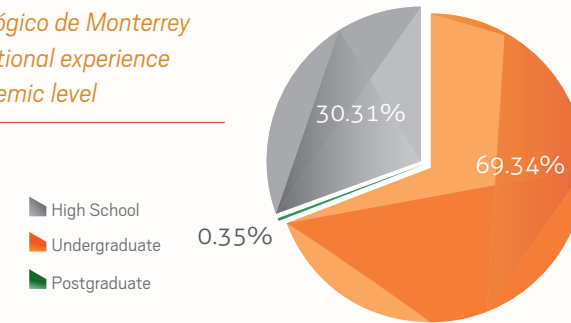

Distribution of Tecnológico de Monterrey students with international experience during 2015 by academic level

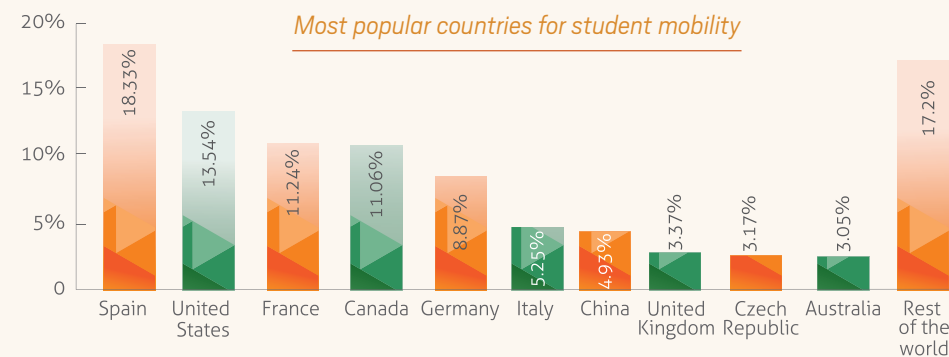

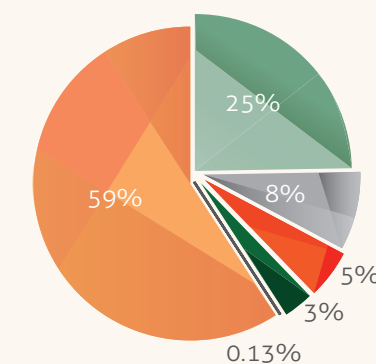
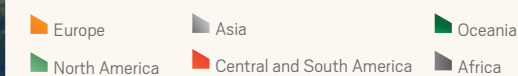

Tecnológico de Monterrey students distribution by regions



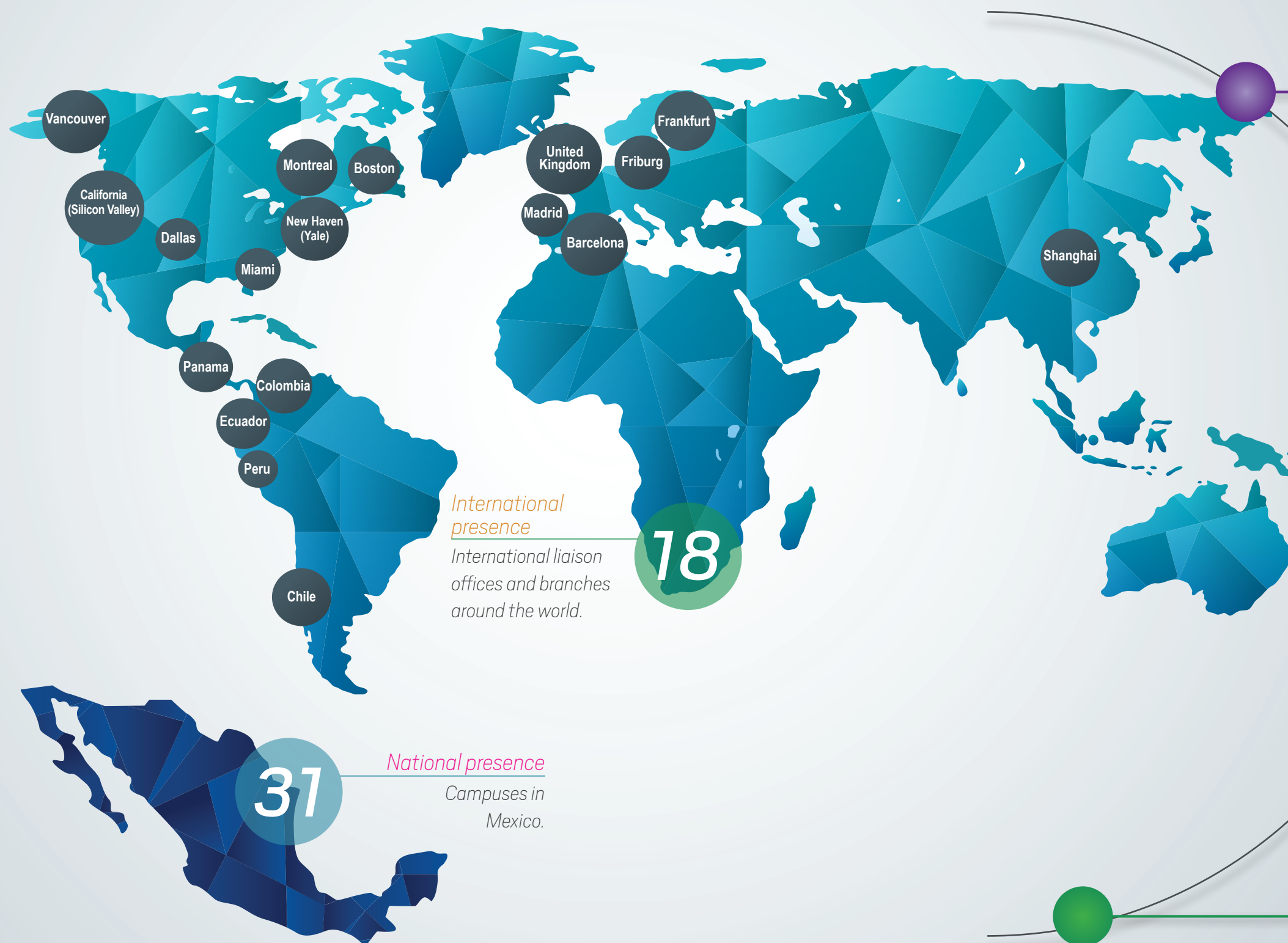

National and international presence

Today, Tecnológico de Monterrey is an internationally-recognized university which, for more than 70 years, has successfully positioned itself as one of the best universities in the world.



We are a multi-campus institution throughout Mexico with 18 offices abroad.

From 2000 to 2015, more than 116,000 students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey have taken part in an international experience, and more than 70,000 students from around the world have taken part in programs at the Tecnológico de Monterrey.

“QS World University Rankings” ranks the Tecnológico de Monterrey #238 in the world and #9 among universities in Latin America.

In 2015, 469 lecturers from the Tecnológico de Monterrey took part in international projects.

Tecnológico de Monterrey was the first university in Mexico to offer degree programs combining management and engineering. It is also a pioneer in programs for entrepreneurship, leadership, the development of thinking skills, ethics and citizenship.

Our five core values are a clear sign of the DNA of the Tecnológico de Monterrey community: innovation, teamwork, humanistic outlook, integrity and GLOBAL VISION.
