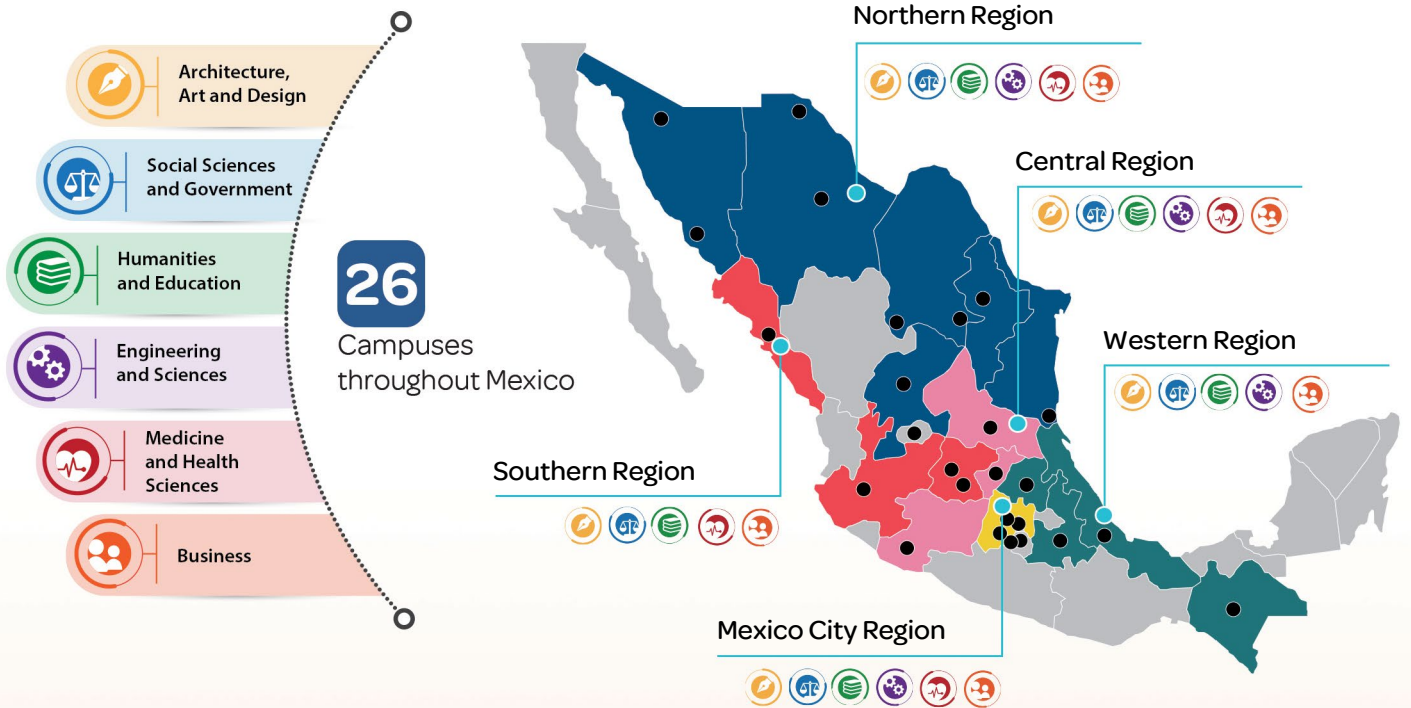

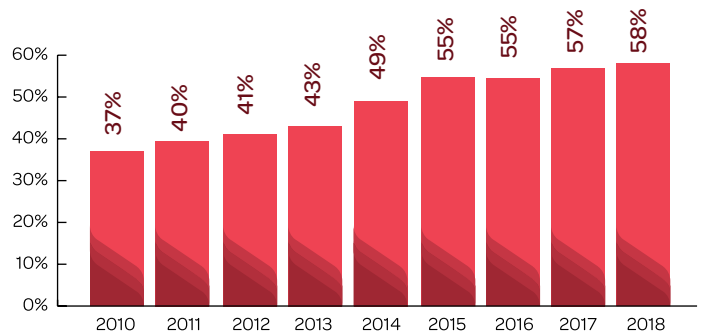

Student mobility in 2018

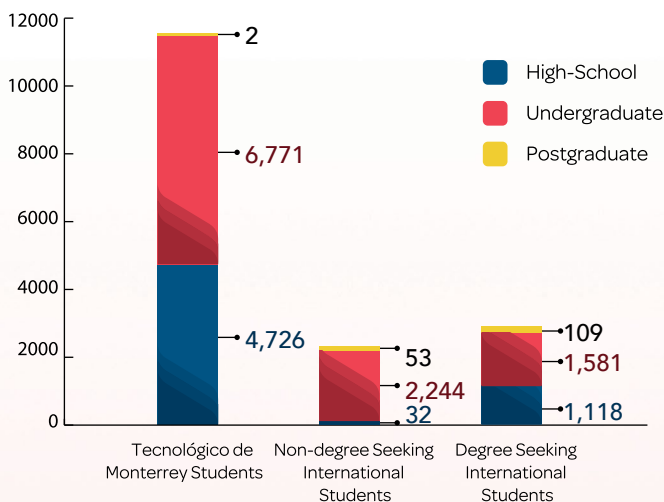
In 2018, a total of 11,499 high-school, undergraduate and postgraduate students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey took part in an international experience. The Tecnológico de Monterrey's campuses welcomed a total of 2,329 Non-degree Seeking international students and 2,808 degree seeking international students.

Since 2010, the number of graduating students who have had an international experience during their undergraduate studies has increased gradually, reaching 58% in 2018.

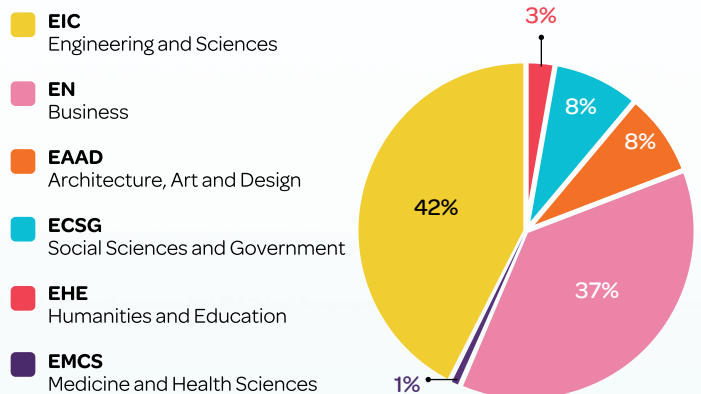

Distribution of Tecnológico de Monterrey undergraduate students by school



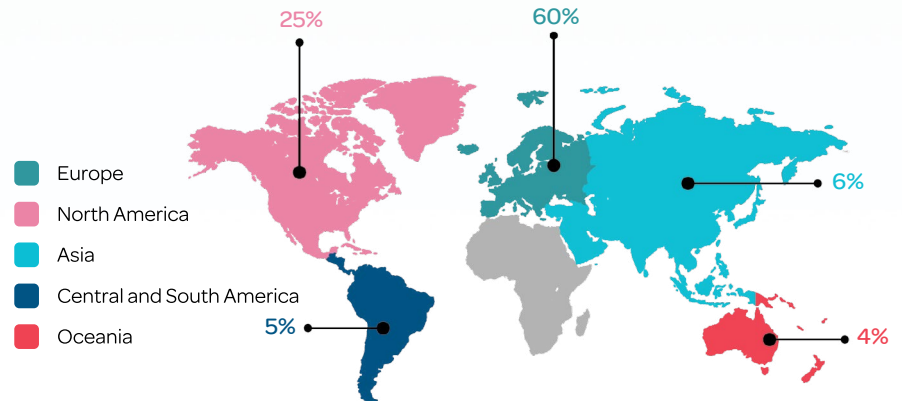

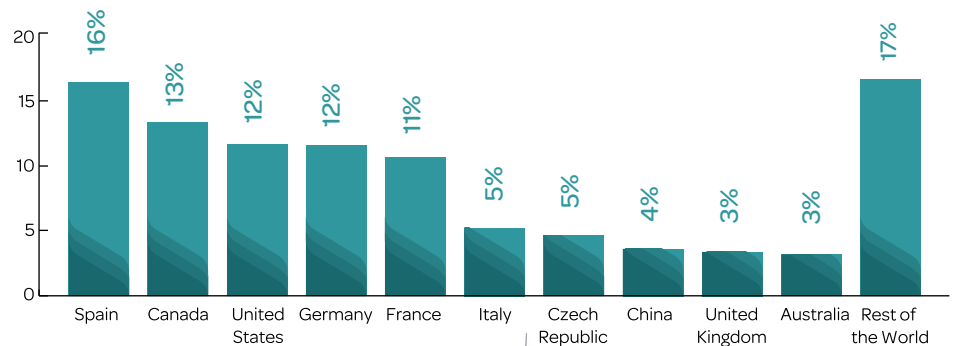
Destinations

From 2000 to 2018, more than **148,000 students** from the Tecnológico de Monterrey have taken part in an international experience, and more than **10,000 students** have participated in experiences at the Tecnológico de Monterrey's campuses in Mexico.



In 2018, QS World University Rankings ranked the Tecnológico de Monterrey **199th in its global ranking** and 5th in its ranking of Latin American universities.



The Tecnológico de Monterrey is accredited by both **domestic and international institutions**: The Mexican Federation of Private Institutions of Higher Education (FIMPES) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), respectively. Several of its academic programs have also received accreditations.



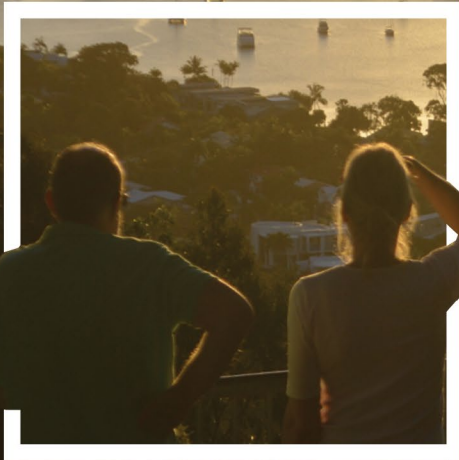
The Times Higher Education ranks the Tecnológico de Monterrey in **110th place in terms of Global Employability** (Global University Employability Ranking 2018).

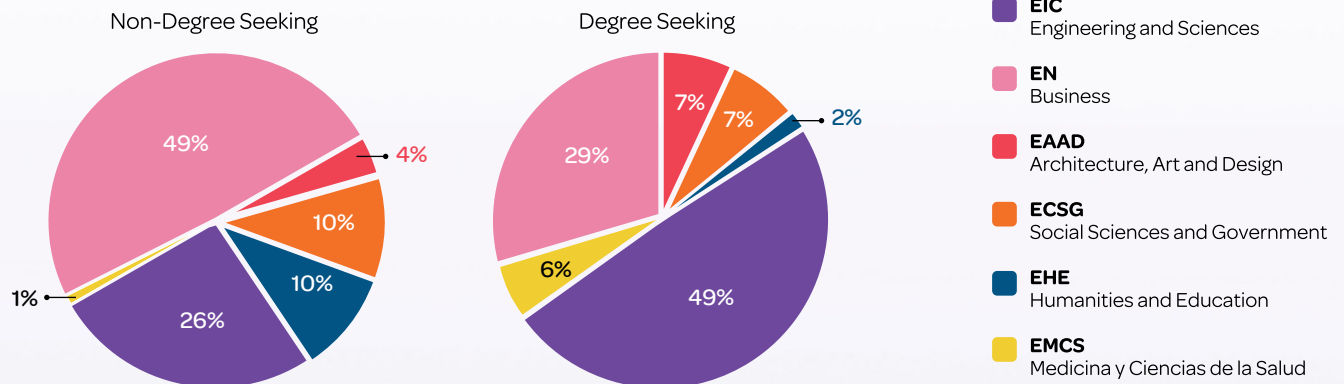

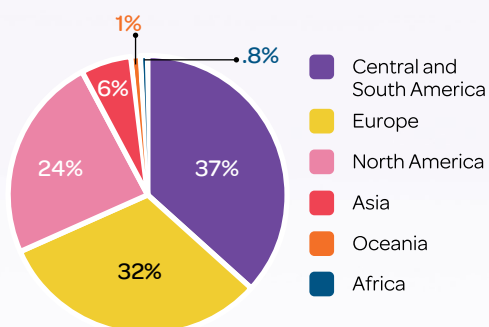

Distribution of international students by region

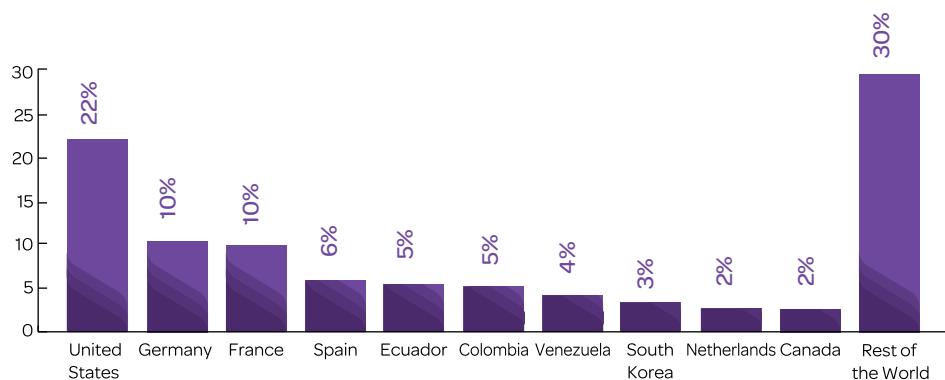


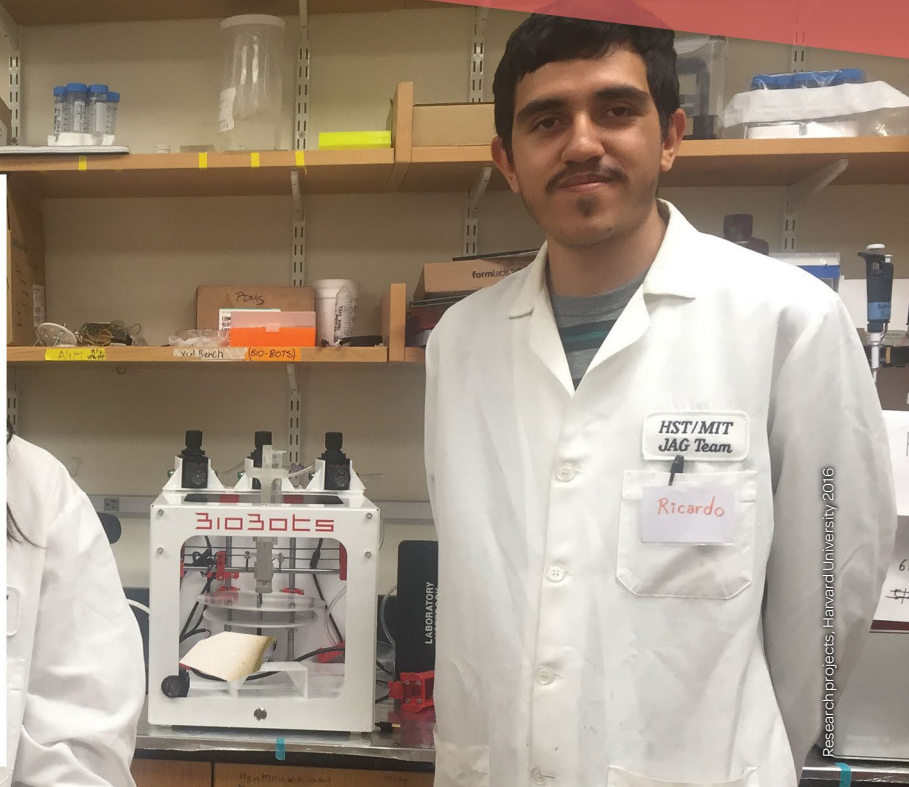

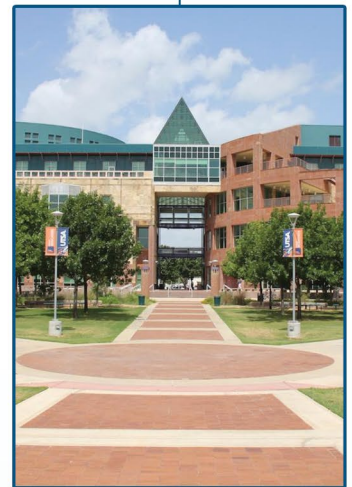
